CITIZENSHIP AT HOME



- Initiate a neighborhood clean-up. Take a trash bag and go for a walk in your neighborhood. Pick up all of the discarded trash along the way. Good exercise and community service all in one!
- 3. To demonstrate to your child how doing her part and working together is important, have her and a friend make a sandwich together. Give them each one slice of bread and allow each one to use only one hand. The bread can not be folded and must be cut to make the sandwich. It can be a little messy, but should give them a taste of citizenship.

Imagine what our neighborhood would be like if each of us offered just one kind word to another person. There have been so many stories about the lack of courtesy, the impatience of today's world, road rage, and even restaurant rage. Sometimes, all it takes is one kind word to nourish another person. Think of the ripple effect that can be created when we nourish someone. One kind empathetic word has a wonderful way of turning into many.
